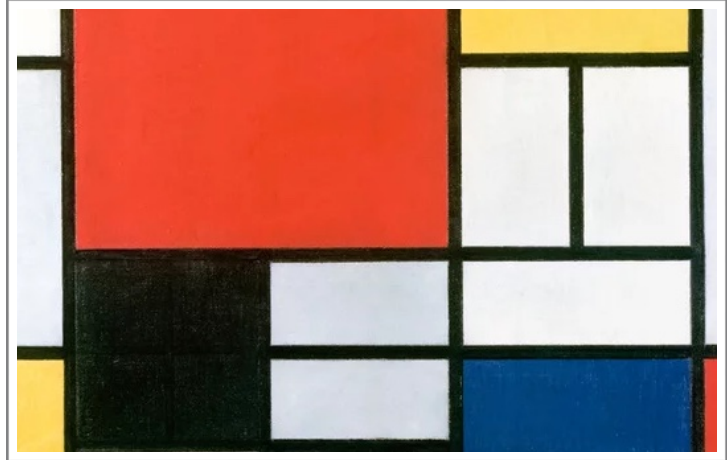
Materials | Piet Mondrian Facts

MATERIALS

- Paper
- Oil Pastels
- Pencil
- Watercolor Paints
- Ruler

MONDRIAN FACTS

- Born: 3-7-1872, Netherlands
- “Neo-plasticism” a word he came up with for his own type of paintings:
 - only used bold intersecting black horizontal & vertical line adding with primary colors (the building blocks for all colors)
- His work only had
 - *Lines*
 - *Shapes*
 - *Colors*
- Still influential today!



INSTRUCTIONS

- Using pencil and ruler, draw “pinkie” thick lines both *vertical* and *horizontal* (draw one line with another line close and *parallel*)
 1. First line goes horizontal-whole page
 2. Second line goes vertical-whole page
 3. Try draw lines that do NOT go all the way across, but stop when they bump into a line
 4. Draw some lines close to each other
 5. Try some really short lines
 6. Continue to draw lines that intersect and have different lengths
 7. Keep it simple!
- Painting: Work with one color at a time - less time washing your brush
- Lines: Use a sharpie AFTER paint is dry!
