O	Greenware: Any clay that has not bee fired
U	Grog: Small ceramic material added to clay body to reduce warping and add texture.
U	Pyrometric cones: Small ceramic material formulated to melt at a specific temperature.
U	Plastic: Clay that is wet and fresh out of the bag.
U	Wedging: The act of kneading clay to expel air, to get rid of the lumps and make a homogenous material.
U	Leatherhard: Clay that has some moisture remains—last chance to attach and add parts
U	Slip: The suspension of clay in water used for attaching parts.
U	Bonedry: Clay that is chalky dry and ready to be fired.
ŭ	Bisquefire: the first firing.
ŭ	Bisqueware: Clay that has been fired in the Bisquefire.
U	Underglaze: Pigmented slip applied to Greenware.
U	Template: A guide for shaping and molding clay.
U	Foot: The base of pottery usually left unglazed.
